40 Shades of Grey by Wendy Williams

Month 10 (Finishing)

General Tips:

- 1. When following the book, an accurate ¼" seam is needed. Check you seams to make sure they are ¼" and if the ¼" is off, adjust before proceeding. Also be careful to make accurate diagonal cuts when instructed.
- 2. If you follow the instructions in the book, you are cutting on a bias edge. I suggest using starch to reduce the stretching.
- 3. Some of the fabrics had more shrinkage than others so I suggest preshrinking all the fabric. I do this by spraying the fabric completely with Best Press but you could also use water. I use Best Press since it also helps with the bias edges.



- 1. The block layout on page 38 does not include the seam allowance. Trim all blocks including the seam allowance so add ½" to sizes shown.
- 2. I started with the top left corner.
- 3. Take one of the Criss-Cross Block and add corner H and corner E to each side.
- 4. Center the piece from step 3 and center triangle A to create the corner of the inner section.

NOTE: The blocks can go together in many different ways. This shows the order I put the blocks together. If the edge of the blocks don't match, just do partial seams. Setting triangles will be trimmed at the end but you should have at least ½" from the corner of the block.











- 5. I next worked on the section with the L shaped flowers and worked towards the left side. **NOTE:** The layout shows that the right side of the layout is 28". I think that was a mistake. I did not get the same measurement.
- 6. I sewed the upper right side of the Catherine Wheel that meets the right side of the L shaped flowers. Stop ¼" from the corner.
- 7. Add the 2 ½" x 21 ½" strip to the right side of the piece in step 6.
- 8. Add the 5 ½" x 15 ½" strip, Spinning Geese and triangle C to the edge of the Catherine Wheel block.
- 9. Add the 7 x 4 Half-Square blocks and triangle D to the left side of L shaped flowers.
- 10. Sew the seam between section done in step 8 and 9.













- 12. Add the 3 Hexagon blocks to the piece from step 11.
- 13. Add triangle F to flower basket block.
- 14. Add a Criss-Cross Block to flower blocks and add triangle A to the end.
 - 15. Sew the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Only sew 2-3" in from the left edge.
 - 16. Sew the strips from steps 11 through 15 and triangle B to the edge starting with the edge of the hexagon flowers block.
 - 17. Starting with the edge of the Pineapple Block, add the house strips. Sew to the end of the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip.
 - 18. On the left side of the quilt top, add the triangle I to the end of the house strip.
 - 19. Sew the seam below triangle D ending in the Y seam in the L shape block and the seam above the house block below the C triangle.



















- 20. Sew triangle B to the end of the flower strip at the bottom left of the quilt.
- 21. Sew triangle F to the right of the Criss-Cross Block.
- 22. Sew step 20 to step 21 and add center triangle A to the Criss-Cross Block.
- 23. Sew triangle H and D to sides of the 5 x 5 Half-Square Block.
- 24. Sew the Catherine Wheel block to the 3 flower block.
- 25. Add the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the 4 x 5 Half-Square Block.
- 26. Sew triangle I to the end of the piece created in step 25.
- 27. Sew piece from step 26 to piece created in step 24.
- 28. Sew the seam to the left of triangle D on the right side of the quilt.
- 29. Finish the seam above triangle H on the right side of the quilt.
- 30. Sew triangle G to the single hexagon block.
- 31. Sew triangle C to the right side of the Criss-Cross Block on the bottom right corner.
- 32. Center triangle A to the Criss-Cross block on the bottom right.
- 33. Sew triangle E to the Courthouse Block.
- 34. Add the 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 26 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the top of piece created in step 33.
- 35. Continue doing partial seams until all blocks are together. At the end, I had trouble find areas I could do the full seam so there were a lot of partials until every block was connected.





- 36. Once all blocks are together, trim ¼" from the corners of the blocks.
- 37. Add the grey spot border to sides and then top and bottom.
- 38. Add print border to the sides and top and bottom.

Take an average of the middle and edges to get the length to cut borders. Since a lot of edges are on the bias, there could be stretching. As much as I tried to prevent stretching, my quilt ended up being a little bigger than what the pattern called for so it is very important to measure your quilt top.
