



Month 4 (Ohio Star Variation Blocks)

General Tips:

- 1. When following the book, an accurate $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam is needed. Check you seams to make sure they are $\frac{1}{2}$ " and if the $\frac{1}{2}$ " is off, adjust before proceeding. Also be careful to make accurate diagonal cuts when instructed.
- 2. If you follow the instructions in the book, you are cutting on a bias edge. I suggest using starch to reduce the stretching.
- 3. Some of the fabrics had more shrinkage than others so I suggest preshrinking all the fabric. I do this by spraying the fabric completely with Best Press but you could also use water. I use Best Press since it also helps with the bias edges.














Half Square Triangles:

- 1. Draw a diagonal line (black line) and $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the diagonal line (blue line) on either the black spot or small star point fabric.
- 2. Place small star point fabric right side together with the black spot fabric as shown.
- 3. Sew on the blue lines and cut on the black line. Press.
- 4. Take twelve 3" black dot squares and draw a diagonal line.
- 5. Place on the end of the bright large star rectangle paying attention to the angle.
- 6. Sew on the line.
- 7. Trim ¼" from the diagonal line.




Center Circles:







Optional: If you have Applipops, they work well with the smaller circle. I starch the fabric and use my fingers and an iron to press around the inner circle.

- 8. For the center circles, I used the 2 circles in the pattern and cut them out of cardboard.
- 9. Cut fabric slightly bigger than the pattern.
- 10. I add a basting stich around the outside and put the circle shape in the middle.
- 11. I pulled one thread to make it gather.
- 12. Iron and allow it to cool.
- 13. After it has time to cool, remove the cardboard shape.









- 14. Sew black dot square to Half Square Triangles.
- 15. Sew the piece from step 14 to the rectangle.
- 16. Sew into 2 rows.
- 17. Sew the rows together.
- 18. Center the center circles on the bright star fabric with the smaller circle on top of the larger circle and use your favorite applique stitch around the edges.
