
Urban Owl by Wending Williams Month 8 (Shooting Star Block)

- 1. Fabrics are right side face up on opposite side from printed side. Laser ink can sometimes run onto the fabric so you always want to be sewing on the printed side and keep the good side of the fabric on the opposite side.
- 2. I use a fabric pencil to mark the sections so that I make sure I am picking up the correct fabric.
- 3. If you cannot see through the paper, fold the sew lines. This helps to judge that the fabric will cover the entire space. I always mark ¼" of where I start. Also trimming along the outer edge (include seam allowance), will help judge full coverage.
- 4. Make your stitch length is smaller so it is easier to remove the paper later. I usually click the down button twice. I would do the smallest where you could rip out the seam if you had to.
- 5. When trimming blocks, make sure you keep the seam allowance along the outside of the block.
- 6. For best results, I suggest go slowly and making sure you are right on the lines,

In case of error: Before ripping out the seam, place a piece of tape over the area that you will be ripping out on the printed side of the paper. This will keep the paper intact so that it won't start ripping until you are ready to remove the paper. I use Scotch tape. Thicker tape will make it hard to remove the paper later.



For the Black fabric, I just used 1 (1") strip for each section. I also used a continuous strip for the bright fabrics (2" strip).

- 1. To start, Measure ¼" from Piece a towards the b. Make a crease in the paper. This will give you the ¼" seam allowance to start off the first piece.
- 2. Align Piece a right side up and Piece b wrong side up along the crease.
- 3. Sew on line 1. Press.

Note: I used an Add-A-Quarter but you can use a ruler to measure ¼".















































- Line up card on line between a and c. Fold over paper piece c. Trim.
- Add Piece c. Sew on linePress.
- Line up card on line between b and d. Fold over paper piece d. Trim.
- Add Piece d. Sew on line
 Press.
- Line up card on line between c and e. Fold over paper piece e. Trim.
- Add Piece e. Sew on line
 4. Press.
- Line up card on line between d and f. Fold over paper piece f. Trim.
- 11. Add Piece f. Sew on line5. Press.
- 12. Line up card on line between e and g. Fold over paper piece g. Trim.
- 13. Add Piece g. Sew on line 6. Press.
- 14. Line up card on line between f and h. Fold over paper piece h. Trim.
- 15. Add Piece h. Sew on line7. Press.
- Line up card on line between g and i. Fold over paper piece i. Trim.
- 17. Add Piece i. Sew on line 8. Press.

























- 18. Line up card on line between h and j. Fold over paper piece j. Trim.
- 19. Add Piece j. Sew on line 9. Press.
- 20. Line up card on line between i and k. Fold over paper piece k. Trim.
- 21. Add Piece k. Sew on line 10. Press.
- 22. Line up card on line between k and l. Fold over paper piece l. Trim.
- 23. Add Piece I. Sew on line 11. Press.
- Line up card on line between j and m. Fold over paper piece m. Trim.
- 25. Add Piece m. Sew on line 12. Press.
- 26. Repeat all steps to finish all 6 triangles.
- 27. Do not remove paper until the block is complete.

When adding pieces, make sure it will cover the entire area when flipped. Some will be centered but not all of them. All references to "card" refer to thick paper that helps "catch" the Add-A-Quarter edge.







- 1. With rights sides together of two triangles, sew along the diagonal line. I used the line on the paper for best accuracy. Pay attention to make sure the pieces match.
- 2. Repeat to make 3 blocks.
- The blocks will be added to the quilt top after the Spiky Border is done.
